Dear Advisors and Delegates,

It is my pleasure to invite you to Berkeley Model United Nation's annual Delegate Workshop. This day long event located at the lovely and pristine UC Berkeley campus is designed to provide a forum in which students new to the MUN program can learn the basic skills they will need to excel as delegates and more experienced delegates can refine their MUN talents. This year's delegate workshop is scheduled to be held Saturday November 17, 2007.

The workshop will be divided into two components: in the morning, students will learn about the basics of delivering speeches, caucusing, and writing resolutions in a classroom setting. For returning delegates, there will be a Specialized Committee session designed to teach students interested in participating in committees like the Security Council, International Criminal Court, or a Crisis Simulation. In the afternoon, we will run a mock session designed to simulate an actual MUN committee and prepare the students to be delegates at future conferences. Ultimately, the overarching goal of the program will be to equip your students with the tools they will need to participate in and enjoy our (and other conferences) in the Spring.

It is a BMUN tradition to reward those schools that most actively participate at the delegate workshop as a whole with scholarships to attend our March conference. We will be awarding three scholarships to those schools that put forth exceptional effort at the workshop. I want to emphasize, however, that these scholarships are not meant to be competed for in the same sense as MUN delegation awards, but rather are to serve as motivation for your students to participate, learn, and develop themselves as delegates. We enjoy the opportunity that this workshop provides to give back to the community and help build interest in international issues and awareness within the local community.

Location

Please have your students dropped off at Sproul Plaza. Take the University Ave. exit off 80/580. Follow University until you reach Oxford Ave (approx. 2 miles). Turn RIGHT on Oxford. Continue on Oxford, which becomes Fulton. Turn LEFT on Durant Avenue. Turn LEFT on Bowditch Street. Turn LEFT on Bancroft Way. You can drop your students off at the corner of Telegraph and Bancroft streets, where BMUN staff will be present to greet the delegates. To get to Dwinelle hall walk into Sproul plaza, cross under the large Sather Gate, and the first building on your left is Dwinelle Hall.

There is NO PARKING available at Sproul Plaza. Parking structure locations can be found at http://www.berkeley.edu/visitors/parking.html as well as links to campus maps, directions, etc.

Registration

This is the only mailing for the Delegate Workshop. All other updates, information, topic assignments, etc. will be done via e-mail or phone calls.

Enclosed is the delegate workshop registration form. Please fill it out and return it AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. We hope to accommodate everyone's requests for committees but cannot do so for those who register after the October 19th deadline.

Fees

The fees for the Delegate Workshop are \$10 per delegate. Please send your workshop registration form back with all checks made payable to Berkeley Model United Nations by October 19th (date enforced by postmark).

Registration fees paid after this deadline are \$15 per delegate.

Refund Policy: We cannot refund delegate fees. Please keep the workshop date in mind when planning for the rest of the school year. We apologize for the inconvenience.

Workshops

The workshops are designed to allow delegates to learn and practice essential skills. At registration, students will be assigned to workshop groups and will be escorted to classrooms by BMUN staff. Students will remain in their respective classrooms and BMUN staff will rotate for each workshop session to avoid confusion on the large Berkeley campus. Experienced students (with 2 or more conference experience) have the option of attending an Advanced Workshop in a separate room throughout the day's events.

Workshop Sessions

- MUN Rules and Procedures
- Caucusing Techniques
- Resolution Writing
- Speech Writing/Speech Making

The Specialized Committee session will focus on those skills that delegates in small committees such as Security Council or Crisis simulation would find helpful to their success. In the afternoon, delegates in the specialized committee will participate in a separate simulation to apply what they learned in the morning.

Mock Sessions

Topic for Mock Sessions are a pre-assigned to allow students a chance to research topics in advance. Country assignments are given the day of the workshop.
